
The Circle of Serbian Sisters original Charter dates back to 1864 in Belgrade, Yugoslavia, when a group of women joined together to aid the sick, the poor, the orphaned. As their membership grew they became known for their charitable, humanitarian, cultural activities.

Following the example set by their respected sisters in Yugoslavia, and a desire to uphold their traditions in the new environment, a group of fourteen women met February 28, 1938 to form a local chapter of the Circle of Serbian Sisters They chose the name Princess Helena for their Chapter. Her husband, the Russian Prince Jovan Konstantinovich Romanov, was brutally murdered by the Communists. The sad life of this Serbian Princess prompted the Windsor Circle of Serbian Sisters adopt her name.
